

There is a record of **Robert Pue 1798** *1798 Claimants and Surrenders Transcription* asking for compensation for "House, Cattle, Furniture, Cloaths, Cash". In 1832 records were found where Arthur was seeking payment of the remainder of the compensation due to Robert Pugh following losses of cattle ad goods during the rebellion of 1798. This was for land in Sligo.

There is a document at the National Library of Ireland called the **Pedigree of Shraheen and Lissadrone, County Mayo, 1687-1832**. I sent for it and entered in Ancestry.

#### From Wales to Mayo:

Starts with **Henry Pugh** from Montgomeryshire, Wales, married to Susanna Studley. Settled in Ireland in 1687 and seated at Shraheen. Henry was buried at Foxford. They had a son <u>Arthur1</u>, who married Anne Frame, family in Sligo. Arthur and Anne had had four sons; <u>Robert</u>, <u>Michael</u> (MD who immigrated to the US), <u>John</u> and <u>William</u>, died unmarried. Arthur died at the age of 70.

#### From Mayo to Donegal:

**Robert Pue** married Hannah Gardiner from Tonorow, Mayo, who died in 1771 at the age of 22. Apparently they did not have any children. After that he married Jane Elizabeth Parks. (Jane Elizabeth Park's father resided in Drumenan, Donegal).


There were actually 3 women in this family named Jane Elizabeth Pugh:

Robert's wife (Jane Elizabeth- maiden name Parks 1752-1836), Robert's daughter Jane Elizabeth 1780-1857 (married Nathaniel Stewart in 1812)

Arthur Esq.'s daughter Jane Elizabeth b 1834-1902.

**Miss** Jane E Pugh of Sligo has land in Ballynahaglish in 1824. I suspect it is Robert's widow and she is living in Sligo.

Arthur Archibald Pugh Esquire, of Lissadrone and Martha Custance had two daughters, Emma (1834-1844) and Jane Elizabeth (1836-1902). Arthur died in 1845, leaving his land to his only daughter Jane Pugh, who married Jonathan Rashleigh. Arthur was married in England, his daughter married and lived in England.	****"Esquire" was historically was a title of respect accorded to men of higher social rank, particularly members of the landed gentry. He had a home in Smithstown but also lived in Dublin on Fitzwilliam Square, where he died.

**Tithe Applotment Books - 1824. Miss Jane Pugh\*** has to be Robert's wife. Arthur's daughter was not born yet. There was another Jane born 1808, daughter of John and Jane Shannon, who lived in Crossmolina Parish- but Jane Elizabeth 1834-1902 has Ballynahaglish in Griffiths.

"Jane Elizabeth Pugh (assuming this is the daughter) had about 300 tenant farmers and she had land in Cloonmeen, and Kilgariff in the Parish of Kilbeagh. Her lessors included **George and Arthur Pugh**, Clossaghroe, Parish of Ballynahaglish and **Arthur Pugh**, Derrynagran, Parish of Ballynahaglish" Mary from the Meath mailing groups.

The **highlighted Pughs** are related to Steven Newman.

At the time of Griffith's Valuation, the Pugh family held lands in the parishes of Annagh, Kilcolman and Kilbeagh, barony of Costello, and in the parishes of Lackan and Ballynahaglish, barony of Tirawley, county Mayo.

In 1869, Jane Elizabeth Pugh, only daughter and heir of Arthur Pugh of Lissadrone, married Jonathon Rashleigh of Menabilly, Cornwall and Lissadrone passed into the possession of the Rashleigh family. https://landedestates.ie/estate/887

The Dillon family held a large estate on the border of counties Mayo and Roscommon. They were descended from the Norman family who had first become established in county Westmeath. Theobald Dillon of Loughglynn was granted over 4,700 acres by patent in December 1680. The main part of their estate was in county Mayo where they owned extensive lands in the parishes of Aghamore, Annagh, Bekan, Castlemore, Knock, Kilbeagh, Kilcolman and Kilmovee in the barony of Costello. In 1876 Viscount Dillon owned 83,749 acres in county Mayo, 5435 in county Roscommon and 136 in county Westmeath. He sold his estate in counties Mayo and Roscommon, amounting to 93,652 acres, to the Congested


