

4 Evelyn Carolan (EC)

Family starts with Thomas and Lucretia married 1798, with son Simon Pugh born 1778 in Radnorshire, Wales. They were Anglican. Simon died 1847. Justine Heywood (ancestry tree) has Simon's grandfather as John.

Simon owned land in *Coolnafarna*, *Mayo* and attended church in Killtullagh Parish, Roscommon, right across the border. Married to Eliza 1795-1865. Per Marriage Bonds in Diocese of Tuam, there was a Simon who married Elizabeth **Bournes** in 1812. Several of their children had witnesses or sponsors with that last name- and Simon is not a common name, so I believe this record is accurate. There are also several Bourns on Griffiths with Arthur, same location, Andrew, Richard and James. They all rented from Viscount Dillon.

Simon borrowed from the Ballanlough Charitable Loan/Rev Robert Blundell* from years 1840-1847. Eliza also borrowed in 1847, the year Simon died. Apparently able to save his land and pass on to Arthur.

Apparently also borrowed from the Ballanlough Charitable Loan/Rev Robert Blundell one pound in 1843. She would have to be 21 so her date of birth had to be before 1822.

Anne 1822 baptized Killtullagh Parish Co. Roscommon COI

<u>Margaret</u> 1825 baptized <u>Killtullagh</u> Parish Co. <u>Roscommon COI</u> 1856 married Michael Sheridan 1856, laborer. Margaret's address was Coolnafarna, his was Longford. They also had Richard Bourns as a witness at marriage. Margaret died in <u>Ballymahan</u>, <u>Longford</u> in 1898. <u>Arthur Pugh/Pew</u> 1830 baptized <u>Killtullagh Co. Roscommon</u>. Married Olivia Heaton <u>Killtullagh Parish Co. Roscommon/address Coolafarna</u>. Civil records for marriage have Simon as a landholder. <u>COI</u> Witness <u>Thomas Bourns</u>.

Arthur was in Petty Sessions quite often, as complainant or defendant. He died in 1915.

*Rev Robert Blundell was treasurer of the Ballinlaugh Charitable Loans. He officiated Margaret's marriage and was Rector when Eliza died. He also baptized many of Arthur's children including Thomas, Henry and Edward.

Family of Arthur and Olivia. Arthur was a farmer and landowner

<u>Iohn Thomas</u> Pugh 1863 b address Coolnafarna, baptized Kiltullagh Parish, Roscommon. Father Arthur and mother Olivia.

Could John Thomas and Thomas Arthur be the same person? Or did Arthur have a first wife? There is quite a gap between 1860 and 1863, and their marriage records are in 1862.

Henry Pugh 1865 baptized Kiltullagh Parish, address Coolnafarna, died 1905

<u>Edward</u> and twin sister (NR) 1866. Edward was baptized <u>Kiltullagh Parish</u>, <u>Roscommon</u>, <u>address Coolnafarna</u>, both died age 2 days. Robert Blundell Rector Birth record for Edward says born 1862 and baptized 1866 which must be a mistake. Unable to check original record Elizabeth 1868 address <u>Coolnafarna</u>

George 1870 baptized Kiltullagh Parish, address Coolnafarna

<u>Mary Agnes</u> (Molly) 1890 born in Granard, Co Longford, married James McMahon 1927, father Sergeant RIC-married in Castlerea Roscommon, but address Sneem, County Kerry. She manages a Hotel and he was a motor driver. RC

Two records- probably the same.

Arthur Joseph b Mar 30, 1891 and baptized the next day. Address Roscommon (church records) RC

Arthur Joseph b Mar 30, 1892 Civil record, address Market Square, County Roscommon

He married Ellen O'Shea in 1917 in Athlone (borders county Roscommon and Westmeath).

John Mathew 1895 address Church Street, Co. Roscommon, married Mary Ellen Newton in Kerry 1925, died 1966, Essex.

Elizabeth Anne (Lillie) 1897 Co Roscommon, died 1984, according to EC, in Australia, where she lived with her niece Maureen McMahon Lynch Bakker

Thomas Christopher 1901 address Castlerea, Co. Roscommon, married Sheila Hartnett 1921 in Kerry.

<u>Patrick</u> 1911 b in Athlone, twin of Ambrose, married Daphne Webber in <u>Southhampton</u>, <u>Hampshire</u>, <u>England</u> died in 1974 in Cornwall. He was a physician.

Ambrose 1911 b in Athlone, twin of Patrick, married Eileen O'Conner 1942, in England, died 1944 in WW2, buried in London,

*Viscount Dillon, of <u>Costello-Gallen</u> in the <u>County of Mayo</u>, is a title in the <u>Peerage of Ireland</u>. It was created in 1622 for <u>Theobald Dillon, Lord President of Connaught</u>. The Dillons were a <u>Hiberno-Norman</u> landlord family from the 13th century in a part of County <u>Westmeath</u> called 'Dillon's Country'. His great-grandson, the seventh Viscount, was a supporter of the Catholic <u>King James II of England</u> and was outlawed after the <u>Glorious Revolution</u>. He founded '<u>Dillon's Regiment</u>' of the <u>Irish Brigade</u> in the French Army, which was supported by the <u>Wild Geese</u> and achieved success at <u>Fontenoy</u> in 1745.

However, his son Henry, the eighth Viscount, managed to obtain a reversal of the outlawry in 1694 and later served as Lord Lieutenant of County Roscommon. His younger brother, Lieutenant-General Arthur Dillon, was given the French title of Count Dillon in 1711 and was also created "Viscount Dillon" and "Earl of Dillon" by James Francis Edward Stuart, the Jacobite claimant to the throne. His son Henry, the eleventh Viscount, was a Colonel in the French Army, but Dillon's Regiment was disbanded in 1793 due to the turmoils of the French Revolution. His son Charles, the twelfth Viscount, notably represented Westbury in Parliament and conformed to Anglicanism in 1767. His son Henry Augustus, the thirteenth Viscount, sat as a Member of Parliament for Harwich and County Mayo. His great-grandson, the nineteenth Viscount, was a Brigadier in the Army. As of 2014 the title is held by the latter's great-grandson, the twenty-second Viscount, who succeeded his father in 1982. https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Viscount Dillon

Also, Simon and Arthur were able to get loans through the Sustainability Loan Fund, providing industrious poor with loans as long as they had notes of security (signed by the debtor and two guarantors)

The Irish Reproductive Loan Fund was created in 1822 as the Irish Relief Committee with surplus relief funds from the famine of 1822, £55,000 in total. The money was reinvested into a microfinance institution, which gave short term loans for capital or reproductive purposes, such as purchasing fishing equipment, repairing sheds for curing fish or purchasing seeds for farming.

The loans were never to exceed twelve months and the borrower was charged a modest interest rate. The whole system was centrally controlled in London, funds were distributed across ten county boards in Ireland and then further distributed to local associations. The committee became a corporation in June 1844, known as the Irish Reproductive Loan-Fund Institution.

The minimum age to borrow was 21 years old and the minimum amount was £1. The borrower supplied their address and occupation. Each loan was guaranteed by two sureties, who agreed to pay the loan if the borrower defaulted. A married woman (if her husband was still alive) could not agree to be a guarantor for a loan. Lending for most of the local associations ended by 1848 and eventually all records were returned to London. There are a couple of reasons why lending began to cease by 1848. Firstly, changes in legislation in 1843 meant that the associations were restricted in the interest they could charge on the loans. The legislation was not changed because the associations were charged such high interest, but they were creating great competition for the banks. The lower interest meant that many of the institutions had to close. Secondly, the catastrophic effects of the Great Famine on the Irish people led many to default on the loans; however, we do find in the records that during the years of the famine the associations are still able to collect their payments and pursued prosecution for those who did not pay.
