For administering first aid and giving blood plasma to a wounded man who had been shot by a Jap machine gun, Cpl. David Gale Alexander, son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank Alexander of Exira, has been awarded the bronze star medal. As a medical technician, Cpl. Alexander was advancing against the Japs and a rifle platoon, when the enemy machine guns hit an American soldier in the head. Cpl Alexander treated the soldier and stayed with him until the stretcher bearers arrived. Gale has been overseas 16 months and has served in New Caledonia, the Fiji Islands, and Bougainville. His division launched the first army offensive against the Japs in Guadalcanal in November, 1942.</li> </ul>

After their wedding they resided on a farm near Watertown for six years. Later they moved to a farm near Anita where they lived for some time. For the last 20 years they have made Exira their home. Before working for Minerman Ford garage at Exira, he was a road construction worker in Audubon county.</p> <p>He is survived by his widow, two daughters, Mrs. Wayne White and Mrs. Joe Strickland, both near Exira, one son, Gale, recently discharged from the service and now at home; one sister, Mrs. Fred Wohlleber.</p>
