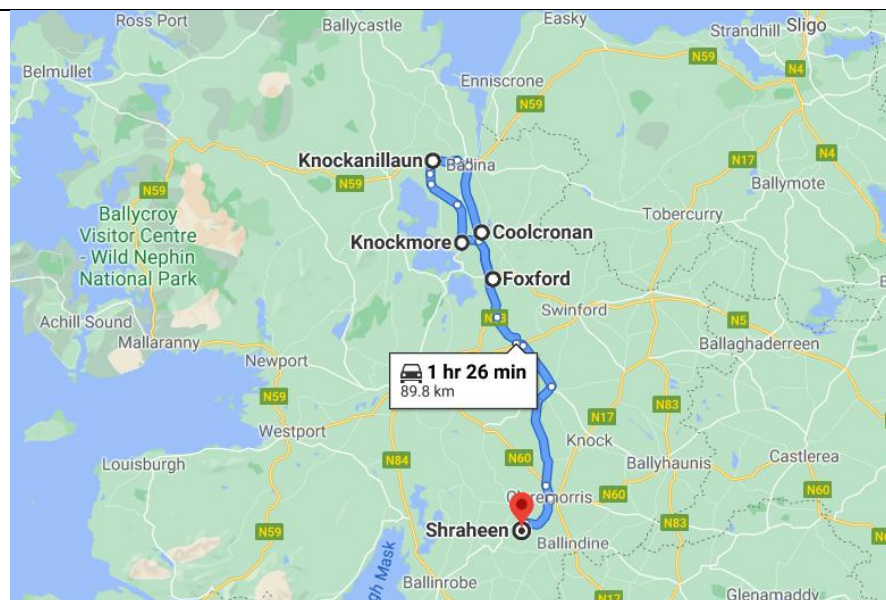

Other Trees-not a match to me or has not taken a DNA test. **He has taken the test.**

Per Steven "My family history research shows my grandfather Arthur (1780 Foxford) and my great grandfather William Pugh came from Sligo".

William Pugh and Mary McNamara *Foxford- they ended up in Galway.*

Mayo place names for SN include Clossagh and Foxford, Swinford, Backs/Knockmore, Belass, Ballina, Pontoon, Shraheen, Toomore, Bellmullet, Kilmoremoy.

Arthur **dob app 1780**—after 1857 (based Griffiths). Unknown who he married. Some ancestry trees have him married to Jane Elizabeth, but I suspect that confusion is around the person they are leasing from, Jane daughter of Arthur Esquire. The question is: are they related? This family was **RC** and Arthurs was **COI**, they could still be related but now separated.

Per ancestry trees they have Arthur, Mary and George. Ned and Anthony are found in the marriage records at Backs/Knockmore parish as well.

Ned or Edward 1805 m Jane McDonell-**Address Pugh's Mt**

Sally Pughen **dob app 1810** m Thomas Mulhern 1830- sponsors Bessy Pughen and John Mulhern. Most likely sister to Elizabeth. No proof as to parents, but married at Parish of **Backs/Knockmore RC**

Elizabeth Pugh **dob app 1812** m 1832 Eugene Walsh **RC Backs/Knockmore** No proof as to parents, but married at Parish of **Backs/Knockmore RC** and Eugene is a sponsor for one of Mary and James Daley's children.

Mary 1808 m James Daley before 1831, immigrated to Ontario before 1841. No birth records, but records of children born in Mayo.

Arthur 1812 m Mary Stephens 1834 died 1896. Mary died in 1897. His death records from rootsireland.ie say Anthony (?)

Anthony **dob app 1814** m Ann Gaughan 1844. Son John was born in 1846, however birth and death records say his parents were **Arthur and Ann Gaughan**(?)-different family? He immigrated to Penn and was a miner, per ancestry. Nothing further found on Anthony or Ann.

What Do We Know - SN Tree Mayo

George 1815- no birth records but he is on the same Griffiths as Arthur and Arthur Jr. He was a witness for Arthur and Mary's marriage and for their son Michael and Jeo Pugh was sponsor for Anthony's son John. Interesting that one of the ancestry trees Alden Akselson, has a George in the 1851 census records in St George, Hamilton City, Canada West (Ontario) which is possible as his sister Mary Daley was also in Frontenac County, Canada West (Ontario). He is married with three children.

Robert Pugh **dob app 1790**- brother to Arthur? Married to Bridget McDonald, address Pugh's Mountain when daughter Mary was born. Per ancestry he went to **Warwickshire England**, he was a linen weaver on the 1841 census, born in Ireland.

He had five children all born in Ireland, per census-no birth records found other than Mary.

Edward 1816 m Ellen Moren 1843 in **Warwickshire. COI**. He was a blacksmith on the 1841 census record

Catherine 1821 m Edward/Edwin Austin 1842 in **Warwickshire COI**. Died 1889 in Warwickshire

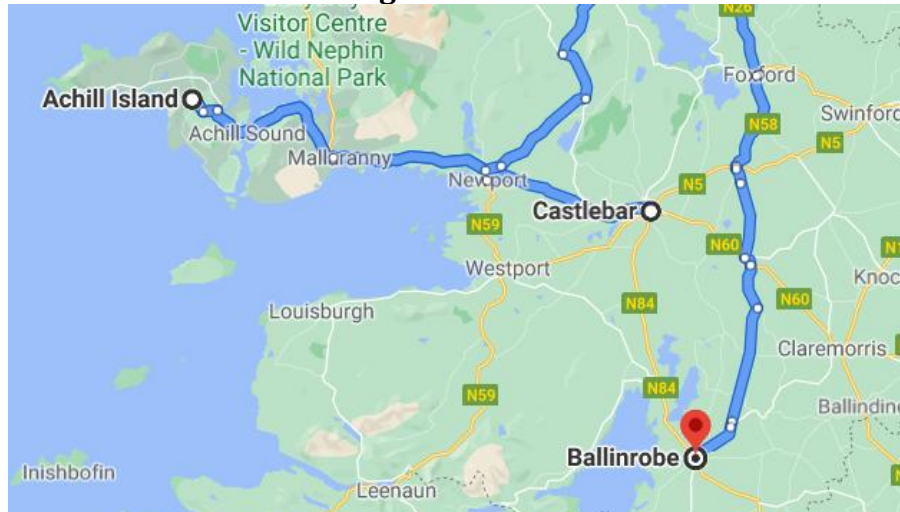
John 1826 was a spoon buffery on the 1841 census record

William and Francis Flanigan



The Rev Edward Nangle introduced a printing press to the island, at the Mission House in Dugarth, and established a religious periodical, entitled the Achill Missionary Herald (anti-Catholic publication) in 1837 printed at Mission Press by William Pugh.

1851 Wm is in the census living in Birmingham, Warwickshire. He is a printer, compositor. 1871 Wm (1816) and Fanny (1816) are living in Birmingham, Warwickshire, England, in 1871, with son George, b 1859. He is a compositor (a person who arranges type for printing or keys text into a composing machine.)

DOB app 1818 William Pugh and Frances Flannigan **m 1838** and son Charles born **1839**. He was a printer and strongly **Protestant**. Possibly from **Foxford** originally, per newspaper. Per English census he was born in Ireland. Possibly son of Charles Pew, on the Flaxgrowers list in 1796? Suspect relation per naming pattern. Or son of Robert Pugh and Bridget McDonald who also had children married in the COI church and moved to Birmingham Warwickshire.

Feb 23, 1841 *Mayo Constitution* William Pugh Protestant broke windows in the RC church at Achill and was fined.

Mar 4, 1845 *Mayo Constitution* William Pugh has a brawl in a bar that broke out after he got mad at a song "the green flag or Erin shall flourish once more"

1851 Fanny Pugh (dob 1817) and two sons, Charles (dob 1839) and Edward (dob 1842) are in the Dublin WH, husband William. Address **Castlebar**.

Charles John birth records are in Achill, father is a printer, parents William and Francis.

Connaught Watchman Feb 18, 1852. Violent Assault- On Monday night, in the streets of Ballina, a man named Pugh, a Protestant from Foxford, was assaulted and severely injured by three men, one of whom, name Coleman from the parish of Easkey, was arrested by Constable Lougheed, but the other two, Durkan and Moran, from Coolcarney, effected their escape, and warrants have been issued for their apprehension. It is thought that Coleman had been engaged by the others to assist in revenging some real or imagined offence of an old standing. There is, also, a very strong suspicion that the Coolcarney men are members of a Ribbon lodge.

What Do We Know - JN Tree Mayo

Arthur /Arthur (1812) and Mary Stephens were buried at Toomore Old in Foxford.

They had the following children:

Arthur **dob abt 1834** m Bridget Reddington 1850 **RC** in Petty sessions a lot. Seemed to be at odds with most of his family.

Elizabeth/ Bessie Pugh 1835 m Thomas Thornton 1864

Michael Pugh 1836 m Annie Costello , probably in the US, looks like he immigrated to Mass. First child was born in 1875. He apparently got into quite a bit of trouble in his youth and with his family. Last incident was 1871 when he apparently threatened Bridget Pugh (sister-in law?). Death records for him in Mass and show his mother to be "Fitzstephens".

Mary Pugh 1839 m Thomas Kenny 1871. She died in Ballinasloe in 1911.

John Pugh 1840-1895 never married, buried in Toomore Old head of household Ambrose Blaine, nephew, beneficiary Marg -entered the service of the Royal Constabulary 09 Aug 1860 Service Ended 01 Feb 1891 Laborer"

Ambrose Pugh 1845-1878 farmer, died in Kilmoremoy, head of household sister Bessie Thornton buried in Toomore Old

Margaret Pugh 1845-1907 beneficiary Ambrose Blain buried in Toomore Old , brother Patrick present at death

Patrick Pugh 1848- m Bridget Joyce 1893 -d 1927, buried in Toomore Old. Married at time of death-sister Ellen Bleane present at death.

Ellen 1850- m George Blean/Blaine in 1876. Died in 1936

Anthony/Arthur **dob app 1814**, m to Ann Gaughan 1844.

Son John born in 1846, his birth record says he was born to Arthur Pugh and Anne Gaughan, and his death records say the same. He moved to Penn and was a miner according to ancestry Regirsun.

Arthur/Arthur/Arthur Pugh **dob app 1834** m Bridget Reddington 1850 RC (16 when he married?) She died in 1891 and Arthur died in 1907 with daughter Winifred present.

They had the following children, baptisms mostly all in the Backs/Knockmore Parish:

William T Pugh 1855 m Mary Alice McNamara. He was a constable in Galway. Died in Manchester 1918

Cate Pugh 1858-?

Winifred/Winny Pugh 1860 m John Dunbar, d 1936 in Swineford. Had a son Joseph b in 1900, died at age of 10 days

Edward Pugh 1863-1864 died of croup

Bridget Pugh 1865 m James Monaghan in 1885-d 1900 in Galway

Mary Pugh **dob app 1868**-on 1901 census as daughter of Arthur. Died in 1922 with niece Mary E Dunbar present.

William T/Arthur/Arthur/Arthur Pugh m Mary Alice McNamara in 1886 in Newmarket on Fergus, Clare. Per Petty Sessions, it appears he was constable in Lawrencetown, Galway 1882 and 1883, in Athenry, Galway 1886-1889 and Killimore, Galway 1893-1894

They had the following children:

Mary Pugh 1886 no birth records, but she is in the Abby Industrial school at Banada, Sligo in 1901 along with Jane Anne and Alice Mary and Henrietta.

Arthur Henry Pugh 1888 b in Tuam, Galway m Hannah Field and died in Lancashire 1939

Jane Anne Pugh 1889 b in Tuam, Galway - she ended up in South Manchester as a servant with sister Alice

Alice Mary Pugh 1890 b in Tuam, Galway - she ended up in South Manchester as a servant with sister Jane

Henrietta Pugh 1891 b in Tuam, Galway died while at the Abbey in 1904. She was sent to the Abbey in 1896 as she was found begging in the streets. Death records in Dublin, apparently sent there-Hospice, Harold's Cross.

William Pugh 1892 b in Eyrecourt Galway

Catherine Pugh 1893 b in Galway m John Edward Williams 1926 in Leeds, England, died 1854

Winifred Pugh 1895 born in Foxford, Mayo, d 1895, croup

Martha 1897 born in Leeds, England, in census

Francis J Pugh 1897 born in Leeds, England, in census
